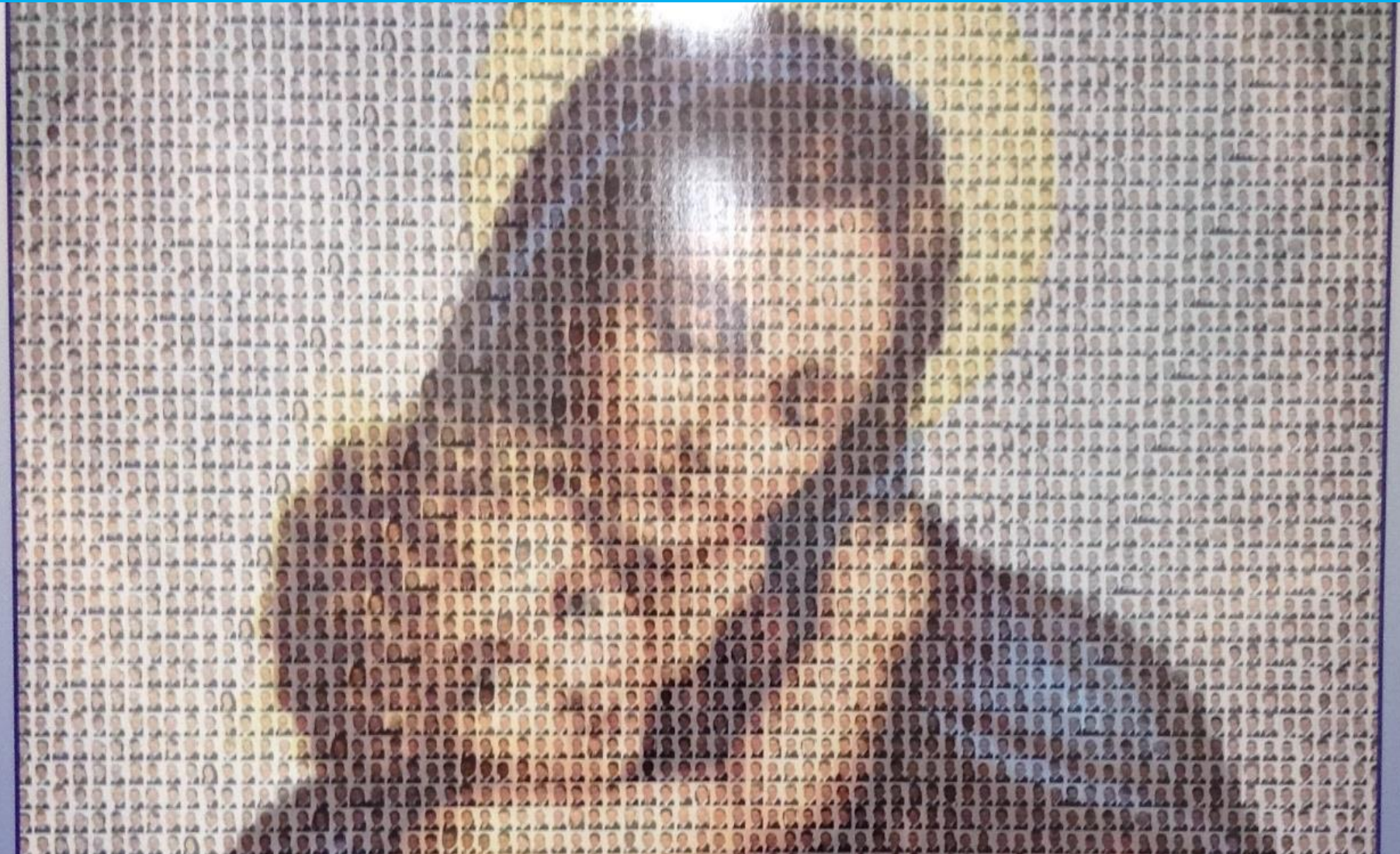

Learning Through Play

At St. Mary's we are committed to ensuring that children throughout the Foundation Stage learn through play.

This allows children to :

- Develop their independency
- Solve problems,
- Develop their concentration and imagination,
- Communicate with others
- Practise and build up ideas
- Learn how to control impulses
- Understand the need for rules.



Learning Through Play



- It may seem that your child talks frequently about how they play lots of games.
- This is a key way in which young children learn with enjoyment and challenge.
- The ‘play’ is planned and structured with effective adult support.
- It allows children to take risks and make mistakes in a safe and secure environment.



Flexible start to the day



In foundation stage there is a flexible start to the day. The children can come into school between 8.40 and 8.50 and finish at 3:20.

As the children enter the classroom they are free to choose from a variety of independent play activities. This allows them to settle into the classroom straight away and start their learning instantly. It also provides for a little time for parents to come and speak to us about any concerns they may have.

Getting Ready For School



- Children should be...
- Using the toilet (with a little help)
- Used to using a knife and fork
- No longer be using a dummy (past the age of 12 months)
- Used to handling reading books
- Singing a number of rhymes and songs
- If your child has any special welfare requirements it is important that we know these so that we can make preparations for your child (please contact the school for further advice)

CRITERIA OF ADMISSION – NURSERY 24/25

The school admission number is 30.



If the number of applications exceeds the admission number, governors will consider applications according to the following order of priority:

1. Baptised Catholic children who are looked after or previously looked after
2. Baptised Catholic children living in the parish of Norton-le-Moors who have a brother or sister attending St. Mary's Catholic Academy at the time of admission.
3. Baptised Catholic children living in the parish Norton-le-Moors
4. Other Baptised Catholic children who have a brother or sister attending St. Mary's Catholic Academy at the time of admission.

CRITERIA OF ADMISSION – NURSERY 24/25

The school admission number is 30.



5. Other Baptised Catholic Children who have a brother or sister attending another school in the Newman Catholic Collegiate
6. Other Baptised Catholic children
7. Non-Catholic children who are looked after or previously looked after
8. Non-Catholic children who have a brother or sister attending St. Mary's Catholic Academy at the time of admission.
9. Non-Catholic Children who have a brother or sister attending another school in the Newman Catholic Collegiate
10. Non-Catholic children.

The Nursery Day



- All children are entitled to the universal 15 funded hours and are from 8:40 – 12:00
- If you work equivalent of 16 hours a week or more (at National minimum wage) - 30 funded hours are from 8:40 – 3:20
- If you are not entitled to 30 hours free childcare care, wish to take up 30 hours, this is charged at £10 a day.
- If you are entitled to free school meals (if you receive income support, jobseekers allowance or income related employment and support allowance) you will be offered 30 hours of free nursery education, including lunch.
- School dinners are encouraged - £2.40 per day
